EB'S TRAILS NEWS by Randy Chapman



All trail maintenance is progressing. All trails are cleared, except for the flooded areas. We wait for ice on the sloughs for that. A lower water table has allowed us to mow through some formerly flooded spots, so we need to do less hand scything and clipping.

About half the trails have been mowed at this time.

We built a short bypass on Beaverlodge, along the lake, to avoid a proliferation of fallen trees, some killed by the high water and, some dropped by the beavers. We still have a view of the lake and the section will collect snow and be protected from the wind.

The beavers have abandoned their home on the west side of Jorgen's, so we removed and leveled enough to provide a smooth ramp down to the water. We also leveled the trail on the hill on the north side of the same water body.

Bob K. has installed new windows in the south side of the south hut. Work continues maintaining the signs and maps. There is an ongoing discussion about orientation of the

maps, concerning whether they all should be south facing so that UP on the map points north. Feel free to weigh in on this.

The Club has purchased a new Can Am Defender tracked side-by-side UTV. We have been doing the breakin running by using it to help with trail clearing. It is currently stored in one of the containers at Eb's. We may be able to use it for some of the mowing.

The Yamaha Rhino awaits repair before it goes back to work for us.

Heather Bernhard has decided to pass on the responsibility for organizing Eb's Day. We thank her for the superlative work she has done in the past, and seek volunteers to fill those very big shoes. (See page 2).

2018 PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS REPORT by Dan Brisbin, Chief of Competition

Ithough March turned out to be Aa pretty good month for cross country skiing in Saskatchewan, cold temperatures and lack of snow in the early winter challenged event organizers and a number of races were cancelled or rescheduled. The Provincial Cross Country Ski Championships were no exception. Saskatoon Nordic Ski Club originally planned to host "Provincials" on February 3rd and 4th with a distance race at Blackstrap Provincial Park and a sprint race at Wildwood Golf Course. Due to lack of snow at Blackstrap and excessive cold both races had to be rescheduled for February 10th and 11th at Wildwood.

Due to the dedication of our groomers, good, if limited, courses

were available at Wildwood and we successfully hosted the sprint races on Saturday. Unfortunately, cold weather moved in again and the distance race had to be cancelled on Sunday.

Seventy-five athletes ranging from atoms to masters, supported by about twenty volunteer officials, participated in the sprint qualification round and sprint heats. The race organizers experimented with the King's Court heat format rather than the traditional FIS format. The advantage to King's Court is that athletes get to ski in three rounds of heats (some of the younger ages only did two) rather than the traditional format in which athletes are eliminated as the competition

progresses from heats to semifinals to finals. This format will likely be used more often in Sask Cup sprints in the future.

Nine clubs from across the province were represented in the competition and they all took home some hardware. Congratulations, results are posted on the CCS website. Thanks to the athletes, coaches and parents who joined us for a day of racing in Saskatoon. And thanks to volunteer officials and groomers of SNSC for making the competition possible.


