Things are in full swing for all the Club's programs, and it looks like we will be getting more snow over the next week, although the colder temperatures may affect some activities. Lessons and performance training have been underway for a while; Ski At School started last week; and an introductory ski lesson was given to newcomers this past Saturday.

All our trails in and outside of the City have been groomed regularly, and the City's trails were groomed in early January – so plenty of places to go and ski. You can get trail updates on our website at http://www.saskatoonnordicski.ca/trails. Please stay on the trails at the golf courses in order to protect sensitive areas such as greens. We also ask people not to walk on our trails or bring dogs so that the trails are preserved for those who want to ski and we respect the hard work of the groomers.

This year the Club has added a hill loop at Holiday Park, inside the perimeter trail groomed by the City. I was out on the trail in December – it is quite extensive and a lot of fun. Check it out if you haven't already – a more complete description follows in this newsletter. Thanks to everyone for making this happen.

And don't forget to mark Eb's Day on your calendars – Sunday, February 16^{th.} It is a great opportunity to socialize around the fire pit with other skiers and members of the Club, and to explore the extensive trails in and around beautiful Nisbet Forest.

FACILITIES COMMITTEE By Ivan English

A big thank you to all our groomers who make skiing possible and who put in significant time and effort to ensure we can ski and run our club programs. Kinsmen Park and Wildwood have been groomed multiple times this year, and new for our club we have added Holiday Park golf course as a way to get our members familiar and excited about the move to the Gordie Howe Sports Complex and the improved trails on the golf course next year when the multi-sport building is expected to be operational.

At Holiday Park our club has started to groom a new loop (the "Hill Loop") in cooperation with the city groomers who are still grooming the "Outer Loop" which is similar to their trail of previous years. As well, a connector trail leads from the parking lot along the northern border of the golf course to the Hill Loop which is located along

the eastern aspect of the golf course. The city has decided to keep their trail near ours in the northeastern part of the course, with the trails taking more distinct paths further south (see map). We are hoping to separate the trails further next year as there is some congestion in certain areas.

The Hill Loop has several areas with potential for further development as fundraising permits to either add or improve existing features as reported at the AGM in November. At some point we also hope to add lighting to the trail where it starts out at the north-west corner and continue it along the Hill Loop.

A preliminary 1 km skate trail has also been groomed in the ball fields next to the oval using the hills built for our future Jackrabbit/lit loop, but the tops of the hills still need more snow before a classic track can be put in. This loop can be accessed from the Holiday Park parking lot as well.

The groomers and the executive ask that all members please stay on the groomed trails at both Wildwood and Holiday Park as the city has concerns about skiers (and others) crossing over greens and tee-off areas which are prone to damage and may be covered by expensive tarps. Hay or branches are sometimes placed on greens to deter traffic, but not all sensitive areas may be covered this way. Cooperation with the city will make our future trail development more achievable.

And lastly, we thank all of you who have helped by donating your time or money to the Gordie Howe Sports Complex project as our club plans to move to a new home.

On Saturday October 19, the blind & low vision skiers and guides had the first of our walks on the Meewasin Trail. We met at the Kinsmen Children's Park at 9:45 a.m., where parking is free. At 10:00, starting at the Nutrien Wonderhub, we walked north across the Circle Drive Bridge and back to the Kindle Cafe by 11:00, to converse while enjoying refreshments.

Saturday December 7 was the Christmas Walk & Potluck Lunch at the Kuntz acreage. It was a cloudy day with a temperature of -12 and no wind. It was an excellent day for walking on George's Ski-Doo tracks. George had packed the snow with his double tracked Ski-Doo to compress it for walking through the bush. We had an excellent turnout of members along with two dogs, Echo and Lola. Most of us walked the 2.5 kilometre trail. Pictures were taken.

Following our walk, we appreciated stepping into the warm cabin to enjoy the variety of food along with visiting. After

lunch we had a short meeting. There are two visually impaired skiers and one guide that plan to attend the annual Ski for Light competition February 3 to 9, 2020 at Kananaskis Park in Alberta.

Diagonal stride ski lessons, by a trained SNSC member, have been set at the Wildwood Golf Course for 2020 at 10:00 a.m. Saturday January 18, and Saturday February 22.
