to 23+ years of age. Our junior program is an introductory program designed for





Our next hike from the same location is on November 18. We are pleased with the number of spare guides which are volunteering to help us, and hope that some of them will choose to become regular guides.

Again, we have access to Wildwood clubhouse this year, thanks to the Nordic Ski Club. We will meet there at 9:45 a.m. Saturday mornings, and ski from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., likely followed by coffee in the clubhouse. Our Christmas Ski and club-sponsored pizza Lunch will be December 9, at Wildwood Golf Course. No Skiing December 23, or 30.

We are working on setting up a double teaching session in the new year, one for skiers (with help from guides) and one for guides.
